Ufton Church

In the interregnum i.e., the five-year period when Ufton was without a vicar between John Armstrong leaving and Andy Batchelor's arrival, the PCC were hard pressed to find clergy - who were often already committed elsewhere - to take Services here in Ufton.

We were particularly fortunate to know Lay Readers Gemma and Peter Took from Harbury who effectively "took us under their wing" and really supported us throughout, so much so that they readily admitted that Ufton had a special place in their hearts.

As the proverb says: "All good things must come to pass" and reluctantly Gemma and Peter decided it would be time to retire at the end of 2021 and appropriately their final duty would be to take our Christmas Day Service. Naturally, the congregation wanted to show their thanks and appreciation — so what better way than a present on Christmas Day itself? Donations were received and we were delighted to present them with a Voucher for Afternoon Tea at a hotel in Chipping Campden. They were delighted to use their Voucher recently and Gemma sent an open letter to the congregation in which she writes: -

"Peter and I would like to thank you for your wonderful gift of tea and fizz at the Cotswold House Hotel. After all my problems with my back and legs, plus the pre-Christmas move to a bungalow, it was a very welcome treat. We do hope you are all well and managing to have some Services.... we would love to visit you sometime and be part of your congregation when you have one."

Apart from funerals, St Michael & All Angels only managed three Services last year: Easter Sunday, Remembrance Day and the Carol Service, but as we enter 2023, we hope it will not be too long before the Bishop reveals his plan for the church and its future role in our lives here in Ufton.

Electoral Commission – Voter ID

From 4th May 2023 onwards, electors wishing to vote at polling stations will have to show an acceptable form of photo ID. Full details of the new requirement are available on the SDC website here: - https://www.stratford.gov.uk/.../voter-id-at-polling...

This gives details on what types of photo ID are acceptable and what electors should do if they don't have one.

Anyone without suitable Voter ID can apply online for a new Voter Authority Certificate via the Gov.uk website.

Paper applications can also be accepted by the Elections dept at Stratford District Council so long as they are accompanied by a suitable passport style photo.

Alternatively, electors can come into Stratford's Council Offices where staff will assist electors in completing the form on-line, take their photo and upload it to the portal. The Certificate will then be posted direct to them.

People have to be on the electors list to be able to apply for a Voter Authority Certificate.

Electors have until 25th April to apply for a Voter Authority Certificate in time for 4th May elections.

Parish Precept 2023 – 2024

At the last Parish Council meeting on 10th January 2023, the Parish Council discussed the precept required for 2023 – 2024. The Precept funds the work the Parish Council does, and pays any invoices it receives. The last time the Parish Council increased the precept was 1st April 2019, (4 years ago).

However, like all of us the Parish Council is facing larger electricity bills for the provision of the street lights. The cost of the street lighting is going from @ £1,000 per annum to @ £3,000 per annum. Therefore, an increase in the precept is inevitable. The Parish Council decided to restrain the precept increase to 10%, which was roughly the CPI amount at September 2022. Any extra money required to fund the streetlight bill will be taken out of the Parish Council's reserves.

Parish Council Elections

Parish Council elections are due to take place on 4th May 2023. Members of the Parish who wish to contribute to the village and help maintain services and assist residents will be invited to stand as a Parish Councillor.
