At its meeting on 2nd January 2024, the Parish Council set its precept demand for the forthcoming financial year

2024 – 2025. Whilst the Parish Council is very much aware of its current expenditure, it cannot predict what will happen to the cost of the electricity for the streetlights. That said the Parish Council decided they have sufficient reserves to meet any additional demands in the forthcoming year and resolved to leave the precept at its current rate of £8970 per annum.

Therefore, whilst households will see an increase in their Council Tax, there will be no increase in the Ufton precept.

Warwickshire Fire and Rescue (WFRS)

Is inviting feedback on a proposed change to its service delivery model as part of its Resourcing to Risk approach.

The public consultation period launched on Monday 11 December 2023 with Warwickshire residents, businesses, community groups and public sector partners invited to have their say on the way that WFRS manage their resources. Resourcing to Risk aims to have the right resource, in the right place and at the right time, to keep people safe in Warwickshire.

The Service wants to hear views and feedback on this proposal, which optimises the distribution of fire appliances, firefighters and supporting resources so that they better align to risk and demand across the county.

Chief Fire Officer for WFRS Ben Brook said: "Currently our resource doesn't match with activity levels. We have more fire appliances available at night when activity levels are lowest, and fewer fire appliances available between 8am and 10pm, which is when 89% of life and property incidents occur.

"One of our challenges is that despite the commitment and hard work of on-call firefighters who serve their communities whilst also having other commitments such as full-time jobs, our on-call availability has fallen from 90% to 35% over the last five years. As a result, the 12 fire appliances which are crewed by on-call firefighters are, on average, only available one-third of the time. This is a similar picture nationwide and we expect this trend to continue in the long-term."

The public consultation, available at www.warwickshire.gov.uk/ask summarises the reasons for the Resourcing to Risk proposal and the benefits that WFRS

communities and people safe. It includes an online survey which will remain open until 10 March 2024. A series of consultation events will also be held in each of Warwickshire's five district and boroughs in January and February.
